On offer is French design – one of Krinke’s passions – but not your pedestrian selection: the labels are high-end and little known outside their home country. There’s a spread of homeware from Sarah Lavoine, on whose label Krinke has exclusivity in Germany; linen by Gironde-based Harmony; and ceramics from French-Moroccan maker Chabi Chic. Look out too for an in-house ceramics line created in collaboration with a Pugliese artisan.

In 2010, Luv Interior Hamburg breathed new life into one of the oldest buildings in St Pauli. Housed in a former blacksmith’s workshop, this purveyor of high-quality homeware offers creations from top international furniture designers including Artek, Arco and Kvadrat.

The showroom, which spans three floors, adjoins the company’s office – so in-house designers and interior architects are always on hand to advise customers. Luv also hosts “Aperitivo” gatherings, where creatives discuss their work in an informal setting and expound on the dialogue between makers and consumers.

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
